God Is Enough: Finding Grace in Our Limitations

Last April, a month after my father passed away, I was able to get away to Oak Island for a reading week. While I did read two books on the Spirituality of Aging, I must confess that part of my week was spent taking long walks on the beach thinking about my father's passing, wishing for one last phone chat with him. But that phone call will never, ever happen again – at least not on this side of eternity.


You know, the hardest part about coming to grips with death is that it is so darn final. It's the ultimate reminder of our human limitations.

Author Donald McCullough observes: There are limitations in life but most of us spend most of our time either denying or trying to ignore those limits...and for good reason. The limitations we encounter in life, especially as we age, make us uncomfortable. But, might there be some undiscovered blessings that lie, hidden, within the limitations we encounter as we grow older?

The limitations we bump up against can, if we allow them, reveal God-given gifts that draw us closer to our Lord and make us more fully alive. Most importantly, as we encounter our limitations, we meet our risen Lord who, we learn, is always enough.

Beginning July 13, we will look at seven common limitations that we inevitably collide with as we grow older. I hope you not only join us in worship but you will also sign up for one of the new Sermon-based Small Groups that will meet throughout this series. Here's a sneak preview:

- <u>The Limitation of our Bodies</u> As our bodies age, we learn to lean on God's strength: "When I am weak, I am strong."
- <u>The Limitations of Time</u> When we accept that time is running out on all of us, we discover how Jesus meets us every day: "Seek first the kingdom of God...and all else will be given to us."
- <u>The Limitation of Our Achievements</u> In the second half of life, when achievements no longer define us, we discover who we really are: God's beloved: "You are my beloved in whom I am well pleased."
- <u>The Limitation of Our Spirituality</u> As we age, we discover that the goal of spirituality isn't to be perfect but to know Christ. "I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord."
- <u>The Limitation of Our Control</u> Buried within our loss of control lie holy invitations. "Abraham and Sarah were visited by three visitors."
- <u>The Limitation of Knowledge</u> Even when we forget where we parked, we can experience the blessing of being human and stumble into the grace of God. "When you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God."
- <u>The Limitation of Limitations</u> Not even death can separate us from the love of God.

Plant and/ or flower care:

Irrigation of plants and flowers is only done in front of the main building and at the front sign. All other areas must be watered manually or by nature.

At present no one is regularly watering outside plants and flowers in non-irrigated areas.

If you like to garden, please volunteer to take care of plants and flowers in areas not irrigated. If the B&G team does not get volunteers to help maintain plants/flowers, the person who puts plants or flowers in areas not irrigated must also be responsible for watering, pruning, and nurturing the plants.

Small shed spring cleaning:

If there are any items in the small shed that are not needed, please let any B&G team member know and we will dispose of the items.



Meet and Greets:

Did you recently attend a Meet and Greet gathering with Bridge friends?

Maybe you're thinking you'd like to attend such an event to get to know your fellow covenant partners a little better.

We are looking for someone, either a single person or a couple, who would like to host the next Meet and Greet in their home.

Here is what is expected of the host: You provide access to your home for usually about 30 to 40 people (no need for that many chairs!). In addition, you provide napkins, paper plates, forks, spoons, ice and a table or counter big enough for all the food.

Guests will bring an appetizer or dessert to share and their beverage of choice. This is typically sodas or wine. The host chooses the date, sometime this summer or fall. We may have one each season this year. This time is usually 4 to 7, and it can be any day of the week that you prefer.
